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II TIMOTHY - The LETTER

READ AND OBSERVE

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to God the Father.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to Jesus.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to the Holy Spirit.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to Paul.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to Timothy.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to time, time phrases, etc.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark contrasts (how two different things are different from each other).

Read through **II Timothy** and mark comparisons (how two different things are similar to each other).

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every term of conclusion, i.e. therefore, for this reason, etc.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to faith, faithful.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to grace.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to the word of God, gospel, testimony, standard of sound words, treasure, truth, sacred writings, etc.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to suffering, hardship, endure.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to ashamed.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to salvation, life, etc.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to power.

Read through **II Timothy** and mark every reference to guard, entrusted.
