READ AND REASON

I cannot read this chapter without exclaiming, “Wow! God really means what He says!” I don’t think He could say it any clearer than He has in Zephaniah 1.

I am so thankful that I am hidden in Christ Jesus away from the wrath of God! He does not destine His chosen saints to wrath and destruction. I Thessalonians 5:1-11

As for God’s wrath, it will come! It will come soon! It will come quickly! It will come completely! He will not miss a single soul! All will be paid the wages of their sin. (Except those who are hidden in Christ Jesus.)

Did you, when you read Zephaniah 1, think that it had been fulfilled? It has not! This destruction is yet to come. There is time, although it may not be long, to call on the Name of Jesus Christ for deliverance from the wrath to come!

The Day of the Lord is a period of time that will certainly happen. It is as sure as the lips on your face. Have those lips called on the Name of the Lord? If not, why not? You cannot deliver yourself. There is salvation in no other name than Jesus! If you have, then do those lips offer a sacrifice of praise to God, and a warning to others that the Day of the Lord is coming quickly?

POINT OF DEPTH

**LORD of hosts!
Jehovah is the God of Israel!
Jehovah does not just control Israel; Jehovah controls all!

To taunt God's people is to taunt God, Himself.
You do not criticize and sneer at God and get away with it!
He is the Lord of hosts and will command His armies to do His good pleasure;
as in returning the reproach Moab and Ammon have leveled against His people
upon their own heads!**

READ AND REASON

Nineveh was the capital of Assyria. God destroyed it in about 612 BC. He prophesied its destruction through the prophet Nahum many years before. God so completely obliterated it that the city lay forgotten and missing until this last century—over two thousand years!

Here, in Zephaniah, it is prophesied that God will stretch out His hand against the north, Assyria and will make Nineveh a desolation. This will happen, according to Zephaniah, during the Day of the Lord.

The Day of the Lord is yet future. So it would seem that Assyrians final destruction and Nineveh's final desolation are also yet future.

Could that mean that Assyria will rise once again, along with her capital city, Nineveh, which at this moment still lies buried under massive debris?

Look on a Bible map to see where the ancient city of Nineveh would be today. Also look at the territory of the Assyrians to see which nations it encompasses today.

Watch for the Word of the LORD to be fulfilled!

POINT OF DEPTH

This verse reminds me of a passage in Jeremiah. Jeremiah was a prophet who would start his ministry around the time that Zephaniah would finish his. They both prophesied to the same wicked people; people who were not even ashamed of the evil they had done.

Jeremiah 6:12b-15

“For I will stretch out My hand against the inhabitants of the land,” declares the LORD.

“For from the least of them even to the greatest of them, everyone is greedy for gain, and from the prophet even to the priest everyone deals falsely. They have healed the brokenness of My people superficially, saying, “Peace, peace.” But there is no peace.

Were they ashamed because of the abomination they have done? They were not even ashamed at all; they did not even know how to blush. Therefore they shall fall among those who fall; at the time that I punish them, they shall be cast down,” says the Lord.

**Are you ashamed of your sin?
If you are not ashamed, what will you continue to do?
If you are not ashamed, what will the Lord do?**

POINT OF DEPTH

God said virtually the same thing to His people through Jeremiah.

“Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, “Amend your ways and your deeds, and I will let you dwell in this place.”

Jeremiah 7:3

Both prophets spoke the Word of the LORD, but it was not news to the people.

God had spoken to them time and time again through the years.

If they obeyed Him, they could stay in the land;

if they disobeyed, He would take them out.

***“Also I have sent to you all My servants the prophets,
sending them again and again, saying:***

***‘Turn now every man from his evil way and amend your deeds,
and do not go after other gods to worship them.***

Then you will dwell in the land which I have given to you and to your forefathers;

but you have not inclined your ear or listened to Me.

Jeremiah 35:15

"So watch yourselves, that you do not forget the covenant of the LORD your God which He made with you, and make for yourselves a graven image in the form of anything against which the LORD your God has commanded you.

For the LORD your God is a consuming fire, a jealous God.

When you become the father of children and children's children and have remained long in the land, and act corruptly, and make an idol in the form of anything, and do that which is evil in the sight of the LORD your God so as to provoke Him to anger, I call heaven and earth to witness against you today, that you will surely perish quickly from the land where you are going over the Jordan to possess it. You shall not live long on it, but will be utterly destroyed.

The LORD will scatter you among the peoples, and you will be left few in number among the nations where the LORD drives you.

"There you will serve gods, the work of man's hands, wood and stone, which neither see nor hear nor eat nor smell."

Deuteronomy 4:23-28

POINT OF DEPTH

Because the people were eager to corrupt all their deeds and would not accept instruction, the only possible answer was to wait for the LORD to move.

The LORD would have a Day in which He would judge and punish all evil.

In that Day He would also give His people purified lips, causing them to call on His Name, and thereby He would save them.

**This would be true for both parties—the proud, unjust people (Zephaniah 3:1-7),
and His humble and lowly people (Zephaniah 2:1-3).**

**Those who would make it through the tribulation of the beginning of the Day of
the Lord would be those whom God had chosen.
If they were proud and haughty, they would be humbled.
If they were already humble, they would persevere.
Then, in one day, all of Israel would be saved.**

***...and so all Israel will be saved; just as it is written,
“The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from Jacob.”
“This is My covenant with them, When I take away their sins.”
Romans 11:26-27***

Shout for joy, O daughter of Zion!

The LORD has taken away His judgments against you,

He has cleared away your enemies.

The King of Israel, the LORD, is in your midst!

You will fear disaster no more.

In that Day it will be said to Jerusalem,

“Do not be afraid, O Zion; Do not let your hands fall limp.

The LORD your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior!

He will exult over you with joy.

He will be quiet in His love.

He will rejoice over you with shouts of joy.”

“I will gather those who grieve about the appointed feasts—

They came from you, O Zion—

The reproach of exile is a burden on them

Behold, I am going to deal at that time with all your oppressors.

I will save the lame and gather the outcast

And I will turn their shame into praise and renown in all the earth.

At that time I will bring you in,

Even at the time when I gather you together;

Indeed, I will give you renown and praise among all the peoples of the earth,

When I restore your fortunes before your eyes,” says the LORD.

**If you are His, sing the above words out loud to the Lord!
Shout for joy over what the Lord has done!
Shout for joy over what the Lord will do!
He triumphs—so rejoice and exult with all your heart!**

**He has taken away His judgments against you!
He will take away your enemies!**

**The King of Israel! The Lord! He is with you!
You need not fear! Do not be afraid!
The Lord is your God! He is with you!
The Lord is victorious!**

**He exults over you with joy.
He is quiet in His love.
He rejoices over you with shouts of joy!**
